

According to the US Consumer Product Safety

Commission, Kidde Fire Extinguishers sold under various brand names that have plastic handles are being recalled due to failure to discharge and possible nozzle detachment. The recall covers the two styles of Kidde extinguishers pictured at left: those with plastic handles manufactured from Jan 1, 1973 to Aug 15, 2017 and push-button Pindicator units made from Aug 11, 1995 to Sep 22, 2017.
