Then, take an open car ferry ride traveling through Lake on the Mountain to Waupoos Winery for lunch on the shore of Lake Ontario. Travel back on the Loyalist Parkway along the lake shore, stopping at the Canadian Prisons Museum. (98 miles)



<u>Day 4:</u> Wednesday - visit Farm Town in the morning, where you can window shop at a 1920's era downtown and country settings, all indoors. A hot beef and chicken buffet lunch will be

served on Main Street in front of a Texaco garage. Upon leaving we will follow the Trent Canal to the Canadian Air Force Museum, where a Lancaster bomber is being restored. (135 miles)

Day 5: Thursday - run to Gananoque for a boat cruise of the Thousand Island, including a hot lunch on board. Also, plan a relaxing get together event in the evening. (82 miles)

Day 6: Friday - visit the 1830's British outpost Fort Henry. Park in the fort on the parade grounds and forward battery. There will be a closing banquet for the week in the hotel ballroom. (40 miles)



For those wanting to stay over there is a yearly indoor/outdoor antique show and sale at the Odessa Fair Grounds on Saturday and Sunday, August 10-11. (15 minutes from host hotel)
